How do you make the most out of your experience with the seniors you come into contact with?

"We have fun. I promise myself that I will make someone smile each day. My seniors make it easy for me to do that. I show up, they smile, and that makes my day."

What advice would you give to someone interested in volunteering with the Care Links program?

"Please give it a try; you don't know how much you have to give until you start.... Plus, the feeling of being needed is amazing!"





Care Links Gatherings-Transportation

Do you attend Care Links gatherings and have room in your car for one more? We are looking for Team members who will **provide transportation** to a Care Receiver who would like to attend.

Care Links Gatherings are for <u>all</u> to attend!

Volunteers are asked to share with their Care Receivers the information and RSVP for them. They are welcome to attend with their volunteer, friend, or family member.

Transportation Corner

Before accepting a ride in Ride Scheduler:

- Check all notes on the Care Receiver for important information under the Comment/Note Section for the Care Receiver on the Ride Request
- If you are not comfortable with any of the information provided in the notes, please do not accept the ride.

Once you have accepted a ride:

- 1. Call the senior <u>as soon as</u> you sign up for the ride.
- Call Again the Day Before to Confirm. (We have noticed that there has been some confusion on the part of the Care Receivers forgetting that you are picking them up.)
- 3. Be prepared to assist the Care Receiver to and from your vehicle (and their appointment) as they may have balance issues and a steady arm will be helpful.
- 4. Complete your Time & Mileage on Ride Scheduler System after the ride.



<u>Ride Scheduler: Helpful Tips</u>

- Ask your care receiver if they have a handicapped vehicle tag (many do). If so, ask them to please bring it. (Submitted by Steven Topper)
- 2. When you call your care receiver to confirm their ride, ask if they'd like a courtesy call when you're on your way to pick them up.
- 3. Should a care receiver not answer the phone/door when you arrive to pick them up, please call their emergency contact (listed in Ride Scheduler) or the office at <u>518-399-3262</u>!
- 4. Engage with your care receiver! Sometimes your friendly conversation is the only one that the care receiver may have that day. (Submitted by Steven Topper)

Tasty & Delicious Recipes

Easy Berry Oat Bars

Submitted by Carol Katz From The Jaroudi Family

Ingredients

- 2 cups old fashioned oats
- 3 ripe bananas (they should be speckled..ripe bananas are sweeter)
- 4 cups frozen thawed or fresh fruit (I use a frozen blueberry/blackberry/raspberry combo)
- 1/3 cup unsweetened plant milk (try Chobani Oatmilk "original" flavor...we like it more than dairy milk)
- 2 Tbsp maple syrup

Instructions

- 1. Mash the bananas and oats together and spread in a 9" silicone pan.
- 2. Blend the thawed fruit, plant milk and maple syrup in a food processor until smooth.
- 3. Pour blended fruit mixture over crust.
- 4. Bake at 350 degrees for 45-50 minutes.
- 5. Let cool and refrigerate.
- 6. Cut into bars.



Cauliflower-Potato Curry

Ingredients

- 1 large onion, chopped
- 2 cloves minced garlic
- ¹/₄ cup water
- 1 Tbsp chili powder
- 1 Tbsp cumin
- 2 tsp curry powder
- 4 cups vegetable broth
- 1 cup green lentils
- 1 15 oz can stewed or diced tomatoes
- 4 medium potatoes, peeled and chopped
- 4 cups cauliflower florets
- 4 carrots, sliced
- 1 cup frozen green peas, thawed
- Chopped fresh baby spinach (optional)

Instructions

- 1. Place the onion and garlic in a large pot with water.
- 2. Cook, stirring, for a few minutes.
- 3. Add spices and stir to coat.
- 4. Add vegetable broth and lentils.
- 5. Mix well, bring to a boil, reduce the heat and cover and cook for 30 minutes.
- 6. Add tomatoes, potatoes, cauliflower and carrots, and cook for another 35 minutes.
- 7. Stir in the peas. I also add chopped fresh spinach to add more nutrition. Cook 5 minutes and serve.
